White wine

1. Pinot Grigio, Lyric, Delle Venezie, Italy, 2012

The symphony of fruit flavours in this Pinot Grigio evokes the vitality and spirit of Italian Culture. Notes of Peach, pear and melon are the perfect accompaniment to fish, seafood and inti pasta dishes.

2. Chardonnay, Spearwood, Australia, 2013

This Chardonnay is a fresh, light white wine with lots of juicy melon and green apple flavours. This wine is of Medium dry with refreshing acidity.

3. Sauvignon Blanc, O&E, France, 2013

Open & enjoy the diversity of vibrant and deliciously crisp flavours in this white wine. This wine also holds tangy citrus flavours and an elegant floral aroma.

4. Sauvignon Blanc, Cloud Island, Marlborough New Zealand, 2014

Fresh and Fruity on the palate, it is bursting with ripe tropical fruit flavours and plenty of zingy acidity. (£19.55 per bottle or by the glass £3.75 per 125ml / £4.95 per 175ml / £6.45 per 250ml)

5. Bianco di Puglia, Il Carretto, Italy, 2015

This lively, zesty white wine shows intense citrus notes as well as perfumed almond touch on the nose. The plate has a creamy texture. It displays sherbetty flavours, combined with notes of fresh herbs and salted almonds, leaving a delicate, bright, long finish.

6. Domaine de Morin-Langaran, Picpoul de Pinet, France, 2015

This wine is both gentle and refreshing with notes of Mediterranean white peach, apricot kernel and zesty lime peel culminating in a silky mouth-feel and crisp, vibrant acidity.

7. Zinfandel Rosé, Jack and Gina, California, 2014

A soft juicy rosé full of summer berry fruits and plenty of lively acidity

8. Shiraz Rose, Invenio, France, 2014

Fruity aromas of raspberry and strawberry, this is soft and easy on the palate, with ripe red berry fruit flavours and a soft, refreshing finish.

9. Merlot, Aimery, France, 2012

The soft, fruity character of the Merlot grape makes this wine agreeably easy to drink.

10. Rioja, Finca de Ora, Spain, 2014

This wine is perfectly blended to give the perfect mix of youthful plum and blackberry fruit with added savoury, spice and cedar aroma

11. Shiraz, Gulara, Australia, 2014

Delicious youthful red bursting with attractive bramble fruit aromas. Mid bodied on the palate.

12. Cabernet Sauvignon, Dominio de Toyo, Argentina, 2014

This wine is smooth and velvety displaying the elegant cassis notes of Cabernet Sauvignon with a hint of Shiraz contributing to the overall flavour.

13. Chablis, J Moreau et Fils, France, 2011 Steely and dry with a hint of green in the colour, like all fine Chablis the fruit is balanced by crisp acidity.	£33

16. Pinot Grigio, Mezzacorna, Italy, 2014 Lies at the foot of the Italian Dolomites. A crisp fruity wine with delightful full ripe aroma	£31
17. Chardonnay, Brampton Unoaked, South Africa, 2013 This is a dry white wine with all the ripe fruit of a top Chardonnay but without the oak flavours	£29
18. Sauvignon Blanc, Nobilo Orca Bay, New Zealand, 2014 The Nobilo family are well known for their fine winemaking skills in Europe. Crisp fresh With tropical fruit and full flavours	£32
19. Riesling, Esk Vally, New Zealand, 2012 Reasoned grapes from two vineyards in the Marlborough region are combined for this masterful wine. There are lots of lime and citrus flavours adding to this very complex taste. IWC: Bronze	£35
20. Sancerre Blanc, Domaine de la Grande Maison, France, 2015 A tiny farm produces this; one of the finest Sancerre's to be found. Perfectly balanced fruit with a dry finish.	£36

Châteauneaf du pape, Domaine du Père Pape, 2012 A Red Southern Rhone Blend generally consists of Grenache, Syrah and Mourvedre, Chateauneuf-du-Pape is a historic village between the towns of Orange and Avignon, in France's southern Rhone Valley. It is famous for powerful, full-bodied red wines made predominantly from the classic southern Rhone	£48

Domaine Jean-Jacques Girard Savigny-les-Beaune, Cote de Beaune, France, 2011 Savigny-les-Beaune is a large village in the Cote De Beaune sub-region of Burgandy, nestled between the hillsides of a sub-valley in the Cote d'Or escarpment. The last part of the name reflects the villages location; it it just a short distance away from the town of Beaune	£41
28. Rioja, Marqués de Cáceres Crianza, Spain, 2011 This highly regarded area of Spain makes some of the best Tempranillo based wines in The world Dark ruby red colour. Fresh notes of red berries on the nose enriched by a depth of vanilla and sweet spice. Clean and lively on tasting with ripe tannins that blend with balanced structure. Fleshy in the mouth with delicious flavour's.	£34
29. Rioja, Paternina 'Banda Azul' Crianza, Spain, 2013 75% Tempranillo, 25% Garnacha aged 12 months in American oak barrels. Lively aromas of spicy black cherry, liquorice and musk. Smooth and warming with plenty of red berry fruit flavours, vanilla and notes of exotic spices. Classic Rioja style with vibrant fruit and integrated new oak.	£34

30. Barolo, Terre Del Barolo, Italy, 2014 This outstanding wine takes its name from the village of Barolo which is nestled in the Langhe hills of the Piemonte region of North West Italy Layers of black fruit, tar, truffles, earth, minerals and dark spices. Full-bodied with fantastic aging	£39
31. Cabernet Sauvignon, Las Ondas Cono Sur, Chile, 2015 A soft, supple red wine bursting with ripe blackberry fruit flavours and a gentle hint of oak spiciness makes up the aroma of this red wine, "Las Onadas" is Spanish for ripple reflecting Chile's relationship with the sea that laps the coast.	£31
32. Shiraz-Malbec, Elementos San Juan, Argentina, 2015 A rich, medium to full bodied red, with a rich concentration of summer and berry fruits with a lingering, mouth-watering finish. The black pepper and liquorice notes of the Shiraz marry wonderfully with the fruit and spice of the Malbec.	£34
33. Pinot Noir, Villa Maria Cellar Selection, New Zealand, 2013 This wine is made by blending grapes of selected vineyards in the Awatere and Wairau Valleys of Marlborough. The vineyards are managed to the highest standard to ensure quality. It is medium bodied with beautifully poised red fruit and very well integrated oak flavours. The crisp acidity and fine grained tannins provide a delightfully clean long finish of considerable finesse.	£34
34. Malbec, Chamuyo, Argentina, 2015 This Malbec is bright cherry red with a violet hue. It shows intense aromas of ripe, red summer fruit, herbs and subtle warm spice. The palate is medium-bodied, rounded yet fresh with soft, supple tannins.	£29
35. Chateau Barrail du Blanc, Grand Cru, France, 2012 In 2012 Barrail du Blanc is delectable. Deepest ruby in colour, the nose is still a little muted with clenched red fruit, dark and earthy. The palate by contrast is silky on entry, with	£37
